Ordinance No. 26 2020

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY SERVICE DIRECTOR TO  
PURCHASE A REBUILT 2013 ELGIN STREET SWEEPER,  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code section 735.052 allows city councils in Ohio to authorize their directors of public safety and service to enter into contracts, without advertising and bidding, for the purchase of used equipment at auctions open to the public or at sales at which such used equipment is to be sold upon submission of written bids to the vendors thereof where the vendors have invited the public to submit written bids or where more than one bid is submitted; and

**WHEREAS**, the City's 2007 Tymo street sweeper is currently inoperable, its trade-in value is \$5,000.00 and the repair estimate to make the Tymo street driveable is \$36,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the City may bid to purchase a rebuilt 2013 Elgin Pelican Series P Dual Tier 3 Street Sweeper with Dual Steer and Gutter Brooms, Hydraulically Driven, John Deere 4045TF Low Emission Diesel Engine, with Hydrostatic Drive and Steering, with 34,134 miles and 5,992 engine hours, as is, where is, for \$60,000.00 or less, taking the City's inoperable Tymo street sweeper in trade, a purchase which is being recommended by the City's Superintendent of Public Works; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is currently operating without an operable street sweeper; and needs an operable street sweeper to keep its streets clean; now therefore,

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** The Safety Service Director is hereby authorized to enter into a contract, without advertising and bidding, to pay not more than \$60,000.00 plus the trade of the City's inoperable 2007 Tyco street sweeper, for the purchase of a rebuilt 2013 Elgin Pelican Series P Dual Tier 3 Street Sweeper with Dual Steer and Gutter Brooms, Hydraulically Driven, John Deere 4045TF Low Emission Diesel Engine, with Hydrostatic Drive and Steering, with 34,134 miles and 5,992 engine hours, as is, where is, at an auction open to the public or at a sale at which is to be sold by Jack Doheny Company ("the Company") of Northville, Michigan, upon submission of written bids to the Company thereof where the Company has invited the public to submit written bids or where more than one bid is submitted and in compliance with Ohio Revised Code §735.052.

**SECTION 2.** The City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay warrants for the foregoing purpose out of the GENERAL FUND 01.


**SECTION 3.** This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and a measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare and shall go into effect forthwith. The reason for said emergency is the necessity to quickly replace the City's inoperable street sweeper with an operable one, to keep city streets clean.
